



Here, Queer and He Doesn't Care If You Get Used To It

Why Michigan's First Openly Gay State Senator Isn't Letting Up, Even After a Series of Wins

In a way, Michigan Sen. Jeremy Moss is a throwback to the kind of classic Michigan Democrat that led to the state's reputation as a union-driven, blue-collar mainstay on the national stage in the latter half of the 20th century. His matter-of-fact State House speeches have won him several national headlines not because they are the fiery, soundbyte-laden stuff late-night cable news hosts love so much, but because they are so earnest. Moss, who has lived in Southfield his whole life, says what he means and means what he says. If that's not a sentiment true of the spirit of this state, it's hard to imagine what would be.

At the same time — Moss, at a solidly Millennial age of 36, is just as much a product of his generation as he is a product of his blue-collar upbringing. He's vocal on social media and well-versed in the modern culture wars. And yes, he's openly gay.

No, he doesn't shy away from that part of his identity. In fact, he wields his queerness in a way that immediately discredits absurd Republican claims about the LGBTQ+

community. He's loud, he's proud and he really doesn't care if you get used to it or not. He's got work to do.

"There was a moment, when I was younger, where I realized I'm never not going to be gay," says Moss, who was elected to the state Senate in 2018, making him the first openly gay person to serve in the Michigan legislature. "This is gonna be me for the rest of my life, and it's never going to change, so I have to live authentically, as who I am. If it's not me at that microphone in the Senate, it's nobody at that microphone in the Senate."

Moss's (very) early political aspirations

Moss may have been born for this role. As childhood friend Lizzie Seagle, who lives in Detroit, recalls, Moss was "super into" politics and politicians even at a very young age. The two went to the same school from first through eighth grade. Seagle says, "Everyone knew he was the kid most likely to become president. His bar mitzvah theme was even 'Moss for Boss,' like a political campaign. Loving politics and loving 'I Love Lucy' were his thing. In hindsight, it's hilarious that a child had such a keen interest in those things."

Seagle remembers sitting in her second grade classroom when Moss broke the somber news that former President Richard

Nixon had died. She describes it as the exact moment she found out who Nixon was. "Jeremy walked into our second grade classroom and announced to the whole class that he had died, as if anyone else in the second grade had any interest in, or even knowledge of, Richard Nixon."

"He's always been passionate about politics, and it's so awesome to watch him actually carry out his childhood dream and make a difference in state government," Seagle adds. "It's especially meaningful to see him proudly represent both the queer community and Jewish community."

Fast forward a few decades and Moss. currently serving as Assistant Democratic Leader in the state Senate, is happy to rattle off the list of wins the party has chalked up since flipping the State House for the first time in more than four decades last November — he just asks that people remember it's been a group effort among various stakeholders, including nonprofit organizations, constituents and the legislature.

The crowning achievement so far may be the much-anticipated Elliott-Larsen Civil Rights Act (ELCRA) amendment, which expanded civil rights protections to Michigan's LGBTQ+ community. Moss crafted the legislation alongside Rep. Jason Hoskins (D-Southfield), the first openly gay Black state rep, who Moss frequently refers to as someone who has been his "right-

hand man" throughout Moss's journey to the State Senate.

Like Moss, Hoskins started his political career on the Southfield City Council and then went on to become a state representative. Hoskins is currently serving his first term representing Michigan's 18th district, while Moss served as the representative for the 35th district before being elected to the Senate. "I'm so grateful for his leadership and his friendship over the years as they have had a profound impact on my life and I don't think I would be where

I am now without him," Hoskins says.

Hoskins describes Moss as "the rare kind of leader who not only lifts up our community but, through a network of advocates and allies, has fostered a sense of solidarity with the LGBTQ+ community."

Moss, Hoskins adds, been has unwavering in his defense of the LGBTQ+ community against hateful rhetoric for years. "It serves as an inspiration to us all, reminding us that true leadership emerges from authenticity, empathy and a relentless pursuit of a better world for everyone."

The ELCRA amendment is one of several highly impactful progressive accomplishments. In the first quarter of 2023, the legislature also put bills in front of Gov. Gretchen Whitmer that struck down Michigan's archaic abortion law, ended the anti-union right to work era, implemented the first real gun control legislation in a generation, and the list goes on.

Watching Trump's influence on Michigan GOP leaders

Moss's focus on progressive goals is partly an effort to move forward on issues due for a recalibration, like the ELCRA amendment and access to abortion. But it's also a repudiation of the lingering impact of the Trump administration. Moss remembers watching the Republican party become beholden to the former president when he was serving as a state rep representing Michigan's 35th district from 2015 to 2019.

"When he came down those escalators and announced his campaign, I can tell you, no Republican in the legislature wanted

him to become the nominee," Moss recalls. "None of them felt he was qualified to run and they all avoided him on the campaign trail, but the second he was elected, they wanted to be a part of it."

"Now it's just a farce that they're all kind of lining up behind Ron DeSantis and want to move on from Trump," he says. "He's just been this indelible figure in our politics in a

really damaging way. There's no doubt that his tactics are to prey on people's fears, to throw facts out the window and to target people who are vulnerable."

Lately, of course, the LGBTQ+ community has been the target, especially transgender folks and drag performers. "The same people who laughed at drag queens and had no problems with them for years and

years and years, suddenly calling them the greatest threat to our kids is just so ridiculous," Moss says. "And that's why I really took 2022 as an opportunity to ensure that that would be the last campaign where the LGBTQ community would be used as a political punching bag."

Moss says he felt there was a weight on him as an openly gay state leader, one that he tried to harness in an effective way. "I knew if I didn't stand up for this community, what could happen. I wanted people to know that there are consequences to LGBTQ hate and, in Michigan, there were electoral consequences. Our state absolutely rejected the bigotry and hatred spewed by [former GOP nominee for Michigan governor] Tudor Dixon all the way to Senate candidates who ran against transgender youth and athletes. I am delighted by the opportunity to combat them at every turn."

Still, Moss acknowledges that things could have gone in the other direction - that his presence on the ticket and his frequent vocalization about the queer community could be a burden on the whole ticket. After all, while progressive voters were clearly motivated by pro-LGBTQ+ messaging, Republicans have ignited a fire among their base by going after the same communities.

"So yes, there was a point where I was thinking 'Are we going to be the reason that Democrats lose across the state?' It was in the back of my mind. If we were to lose, how would we move forward as a community? But you have to have faith in reasonable people, compassionate people who just want everybody to have a fair shake, and Michiganders rejected the hatred and bigotry and embraced our community," he adds.

Time to relax... or not

With the amendment a done deal and the legislature solidly blue (at least for a while), it would surely be easier for Moss to take a breather. But as Republicans push transphobic rhetoric nationally and in pockets across Michigan, Moss is as fired up as he was when the then GOP-led Senate failed to pass a Pride Month resolution in 2022. In a Senate floor speech at the time, he said, "The Republican leadership





regresses and again throws Pride Month back into the trash heap. I guess the cruelty is the point. ... The Republican leadership will never stand for LGBTQ equality."

"Their agenda is to make you fear the gay agenda, but I am not the cause of your problems. My community is not the cause of your problems."

A year later, with the power of the majority on his side, Moss is practically daring the opposing party to bring homophobic and transphobic messaging to the table. "I want to show the lawmakers who are perpetrating this that they won't get one syllable of homophobia and transphobia out without expecting it to be rebutted by me," he says. "I want them to know that if they say anything, they will not get away with it without me coming to the same Senate microphone to combat it."

Moss thinks the trajectory in other

states could rapidly shift if more LGBTQ+ candidates emerged, even in typically conservative areas. "We need more LGBTQ candidates who step up as mothers and fathers, as taxpayers and homeowners and members of society in their own right," he says. "But also by bringing their lived queer experiences to represent our community in these spaces."

Moss contends that for the last several years, the Elliott-Larsen amendment had enough bipartisan support to pass, but the "extreme fringe" of the Republican leadership refused to bring it to the floor vote. And, in fact, several Republicans did join Democrats when the time came. "So, remember — in these Republican states, just because they have loud, extreme members of their leadership that prevent these votes from coming forward, don't let anyone feel like there isn't a majority here in

this country that supports LGBTQ rights," he says. "We just have the lawmakers in place to do it."

As passionate as he is about LGBTQ+ issues, advocating for the community is far from his sole passion. "I am a gay person, but that doesn't mean it's all gay all the time," he says. "All of us are living our lives and have other priorities."

For example, Moss currently serves as Senate President Pro Tem and as chairman of the Senate Elections and Ethics Committee, a role that has him focused on protecting literal (small d) democracy. This work involves removing barriers to voting by increasing initiatives like early and absentee voting and to clean up Lansing, which Moss says has been plagued by "scandal after scandal after scandal."

To that end, Moss has been working on rectifying a situation that has left Michigan as one of only two states where a lawmaker does not have to disclose financial conflicts of interest related to proposed legislation. "We need to know whether or not somebody's being personally enriched by legislation that they're introducing or moving," he explains. "We've just seen too many dark moneyed interests have a lot of influence over the process. It's important to me and to our entire democracy to make sure people have faith and confidence that their government actors are working on their behalf and nobody else's."

When Moss isn't working, he's... well, he's probably working. Asked about his downtime, he laughs. Sure, he might make his way to a place like Soho, a queer bar in Ferndale, on occasion — in fact, it's not unusual for constituents to find him there — but it's likely not for a fun night out on the town. Instead, he's more likely among rowdy bargoers discussing a homeowner's association issue over a beer at 1 a.m. To be clear, he's not unhappy about this circumstance.

"I'm a member of the community; I'm not different and not separate," he says. "There is no off the clock."

LGBTQ+ Civil Rights Expansion in Michigan Was 50 Years in the Making

Michigan's LGBTQ+ community has had much to celebrate in 2023, thanks to the efforts of a state legislature led by the Democratic party for the first time in more than 40 years. Most notably was Gov. Gretchen Whitmer's signing of an amendment to the Elliott-Larsen Civil Rights Act that expanded legal protections against discrimination to the LGBTQ+ community. We owe a debt of gratitude to those who came before to rally, lobby,

vote and shout from the rooftops that it doesn't matter who you are or whom you love, we are all worthy of protection under state law. It's a great time to be a queer Michigander. Let's celebrate — then get back to work.

"I've been waiting my whole adult life for this," Tim Retzloff told Pride Source. The Michigan State University history professor and LGBTQ+ historian took a trip to his storage unit to peruse vintage news

clippings to help Pride Source compile this timeline, which follows a journey toward equality rooted in a few brave first steps taken by Michigan activists in the 1960s who entrusted the fight to the generations that came after them. The weight of that responsibility is not lost on modern LGBTQ+ leaders and allies, who have worked tirelessly to enshrine LGBTQ+ rights into Michigan law to benefit generations to come.

1963: The Michigan Civil Rights Commission (MCRC) is created.

> 1966: State Rep Daisy Elliott (D-Detroit) attempts to pass a law modeled after the Civil Rights Act of 1964. She is told it will fail without a Republican co-sponsor. With voters including Democrats — leery after the 1968 Detroit riots, legislation would not be introduced for several years.

1976: The Elliott-Larsen Civil Rights Act (ELCRA) is introduced, barring discrimination in Michigan on the basis of "religion, race, color, national origin, age, sex, height, weight and familial status" in employment, housing, education and public accommodations.

> 1977: The Michigan Organization for Human Rights (MOHR) is founded.

1983: Closeted gay Republican Jim Dressel of Holland introduces an amendment to protect gay and lesbian people from discrimination in employment and housing, the first such bill. A former president of the Michigan Organization for Human Rights, Dressel dies in 1992 of AIDS-related pneumonia.

According to Retzloff, at one time, an amendment was introduced to explicitly exclude "homosexuals" from protection against discrimination, as a pre-emptive

The Fight Begins

1964: The federal Civil Rights Act of 1964 prohibits discrimination on the basis of race, color, religion, sex or national origin.

June 28, 1969: Following a police raid at the Stonewall Inn, a series of LGBTQ+ uprisings launches the gay liberation movement and the modern fight for LGBTQ+ rights in the U.S.

> June 1972: Christopher Street Detroit is the first Pride celebration in Michigan, with events in Detroit, Ann Arbor and Greater Lansing.

1977: Named for its primary sponsors, Daisy Elliott (D-Detroit) and Melvin (Mel) Larsen (R-Oxford), ELCRA is signed into law by Gov. William Milliken. Notably, Milliken's daughter, Elaine, was gay.

Larsen was elected in 1973 and served on the House civil rights committee. He was a former Catholic high school principal with a deep commitment to civil rights.

> Years later, Larsen recalled, "At the time, most of the legislature was Democrat and white male that had come out of suburban, rural areas while the Black community was mostly urban. The attitude

of the legislature toward the civil rights act? They would probably have preferred a root canal." From the beginning, LGBTQ+ activists insisted they be included. It would be almost 50 years before that came to fruition.

Ronald Reagan's presidency AIDS crisis seriously.

For context, the era of (1981 to 1989) was not a popular time for LGBTQ+ rights. It wouldn't be until 1987 that he addressed the



"Michigan was known as a 'lost state," said Jay Kaplan, ACLU of Michigan staff attorney for the LGBT Project. Kaplan has been with the organization for 22 years. He recalled the tenure of Republican Gov. John Engler, (1991 to 2003) and "a legislature that was hostile towards the idea of LGBTQ rights" in addition to a politicized state supreme court where several clearly anti-LGBTQ+ justices served.

"Every time those bills were introduced, there would be a press release, a press conference," Kaplan said. "But you know, it's pretty much dead on arrival because the Republican leadership was not going to let those bills get a vote."



2001: Chris Kolb is elected Michigan's first openly LGBTQ+ state legislator. He is the first of many co-sponsors of an ELCRA bill that year, introduced by Rep Patricia "Pan" Godchaux. Kolb also introduces bills that would expand ELCRA in 2003 and 2005. Later, he would serve as the state of Michigan's budget director for two years, following his appointment by Gov. Gretchen Whitmer in 2019. Today he is vice president for government relations at the University of Michigan Ann Arbor.

March 25, 2013: The Michigan Department of Civil Rights issues a "Report on LGBT Inclusion Under Michigan Law." It is adopted by the MCRC.

Late '80s: Jan Stevenson moves to Michigan and becomes Affirmations LGBTQ+ community center's first executive director in 1991. In 1993, she and wife Susan Horowitz begin publishing Between The Lines.

"I remember going into one of my first [MOHR] meetings when I first came to Michigan [and] the goal was to get Elliott-Larsen amended, and that was in 1988 when I first moved here," Stevenson said. "And every year thereafter, we would sit down as a group and say, 'OK, what are the plans? What are the goals for this year?' And whether it was Jeff Montgomery or any of the many people, many of whom are gone now, I wish they were still here to be able to see it. Every year we'd beat our head against the wall and say, 'How can we get this done?', and we'd try and come up empty."

With the expansion of ELCRA, Stevenson said, "It's a unique feeling because for most, if not all of my adult life, I've been on the outside of the law, and to actually feel like I have full citizenship with full citizen rights is unique for me. I'm 70 years old, and I've never experienced feeling fully protected under the law."

2014: Republican Gov. Rick Snyder expresses support for adding LGBTQ+ protections to ELCRA and encourages the state Legislature to take up the issue.

Early 2000s

A Lost State

1994: MOHR is disbanded and the Triangle Foundation becomes the state's LGBTQ+ rights organization.

> 2001: In 2001, Representatives William McConico, Chris Kolb and Buzz Thomas (pictured here) introduced a package of pro-LGBTQ bills that went nowhere. As McConico, a powerful ally today as District Court Judge, told Pride Source in 2020, some Democrats told him privately they would not be able to vote for such legislation. Buzz Thomas served in the state House and Senate from 1997 to 2011. He wasn't out publicly, but fought just as hard for LGBTQ+ causes. "I'm feeling pretty equal today," said Thomas, who now serves as chair of Equality Michigan. "That period of time personally began my activism in supporting our community and being able to stand up for myself," he added.



2004: By popular vote, the Michigan Constitution is amended to prohibit marriage of same-sex couples.



Nov. 24, 2014: The MCRC adopts a resolution in support of expanding ELCRA to include sexual orientation and gender identity.

"Check your politics at the door on this one and do what is right for the state," said Foster, whose bill would have added sexual orientation. By that point he had already lost his primary. Foster tells Time magazine he has no regrets.

2018: Several of those interviewed commented on the significance of election 2018's Proposal 2, powered by Voters Not Politicians activists. The passage of this initiative would end Republicans' stranglehold on the state legislature. Not to be forgotten is Michigan Supreme Court justice Elizabeth Clement's role in ensuring the proposal appeared on the ballot. A Republican and Snyder-appointee, she told Pride Source in 2019 she was booed at her party's convention for her action.

May 21, 2018: By a 5-0-1 vote, the MCRC issues an interpretive statement on the meaning of "sex" in ELCRA. The motion is presented by Commissioner Alma Wheeler Smith. In a 19-page opinion, Attorney General Bill Schuette calls the ruling invalid. Within days, the MCRC responds that they will continue to hear cases of LGBTQ+ discrimination.

Jan. 2019: Gov. Whitmer signs an executive directive prohibiting state employment discrimination on grounds of sexual orientation and gender identity. In her first State of the State address, Whitmer discusses amending ELCRA.

2018 to 2021

The Tide Turns



2018: Gretchen Whitmer defeats former AG Schuette and is elected governor. Dana Nessel is elected attorney general, becoming Michigan's highest ranking openly LGBTQ+ elected official.

2021: Fair and Equal Michigan releases a scathing statement criticizing the Board of Elections' decision.

2019: The Equality Act is introduced at the federal level. It would effectively amend the Civil Rights Act of 1964 to include protections for LGBTQ+ people. On May 17, the bill passes the House. The U.S. Senate does not act. It continues to be reintroduced.

2020: The Fair and Equal ballot initiative is launched. With broader support than the first attempt, yet with some of the same lingering criticism, what appeared promising became a casualty of the Covid-19 pandemic. Despite a huge push to collect electronic signatures, the Michigan Supreme Court ultimately ruled they were inadequate in number.



2022: Seven openly LGBTQ+ state legislators, including Sen. Jeremy Moss (D-Southfield, pictured above) are elected, and many more are candidates. Democratic majorities rule the House and Senate for the first time in 40 years. Gov. Whitmer, a steadfast ally, is reelected by a wide



The MCRC adopts a resolution in support of amending ELCRA, introduced by that body's first openly LGBTQ+ commissioner, Luke Londo, an Independent.



Jan. 2021: Michigan is ranked among lowest in HRC's annual State Equality Index.



July 2022: After out lesbian AG Nessel argues in front of the Michigan Supreme Court, the justices rule in a 5-2 decision in the Rouch World case that "sex" is inclusive of sexual orientation and gender identity in ELCRA. Gov. Whitmer calls it "a monumental victory." The majority opinion is written by Snyder-appointee Clement.

March 2023: Bills aimed at amending the ELCRA are introduced in both chambers of the Statehouse. SB4 is adopted by the Senate in a bipartisan 23-15 vote, with three Republicans joining the Democrats. HB4003 is adopted by the House in a bipartisan 64-45. Of the eight Republicans joining their Democratic colleagues is Bill Schuette (R-Midland), son of the former attorney general.

Whitmer Makes It **Official**

Gov. Whitmer makes good on her promise to sign the legislation at a ceremony at Urban Beat in Lansing where she stands beside Mel Larsen, for whom the 1976 act is named. Whitmer's openly gay daughter, Sherry, is in the room. "It's about damn time," Whitmer said, quoting Detroit-born performer Lizzo.

Next steps: "This is exactly what Michiganders voted for last November," said Erin Knott, executive director of Equality Michigan. "This is the message that the people here in our state are trying to send to the rest of the country: Hate has no room here, no place here. We are a welcoming and inclusive state."

A Kind of Defiance

In Lansing, an Overlooked
– and Leading – History
of Queer Activism

It's only natural for a state capital to become a center for political activism. But in the case of Lansing, both local and state-level queer activism have taken on a remarkable variety of forms. From early flickers of visibility there in the 1950s and '60s to feminist-lesbian coalitional work rippling out from the 1970s across decades, the city's history makes clear that the gains won last March, with LGBTQ+ protections being enshrined within the Elliott-Larsen Civil Rights Act, didn't spring from nowhere.

As activists, historians, archivists and residents of the city have emphasized, these victories were the result of hard work — leading to bits of progress that could,

with some effort, be undone. Even so, the city (and state) have come a long way.

Of the city's early history, Tim Retzloff, a Lansing resident, Pride Source contributor and queer historian at Michigan State University (MSU), observes that the climate for queer people (at least those we'd regard that way now) in the 1930s and '40s could be oppressive in Lansing (and next door in the smaller city of East Lansing, home to the university). Even within the insulated bubble of a campus environment, being out for most anyone proved an impossibility. While the city's university presence attracted a mix of people - some queer and others openminded — the visibility, prestige and the school's state ties also made it a target for a sort of "clamping down," according to Retzloff.

"There were these kind of agents in society and of the state at the university — and certainly in the city of East Lansing and Lansing — that tried to tamp down

any kind of nonconformity in terms of sexuality and gender," Retzloff observes, citing the university's concerns about reputational harm. But, at the same time, he suggests, "there were definitely people who were finding each other."

As a result of these kinds of tensions, pre-1950s evidence of queer community in Lansing remains "fragmentary," but still present, Retzloff says, describing the city's queer people then as living in a kind of "defiance against social norms."

Within both our Zoom conversation and his sweeping overview of the city's LGBTQ+ history for the queer-owned publication City Pulse in Lansing, he notes the quiet presence of Lucile Portwood and Evelyn Sanders, a lesbian couple who moved to the area in the early 1940s for school and became known, beyond their careers, for their successful entrants in dog shows. Around the same time, Alma Goetsch and Kathrine Winckler, another couple, joined MSU's

art faculty and commissioned a Frank Lloyd Wright House in nearby Okemos. Retzloff notes that Albert Hakala, too — a gay man Retzloff interviewed for City Pulse last summer — taught at Lansing's Eastern High School alongside his partner and fellow educator, Bob Walker, who eventually became the school's vice principal. The two had managed to meet despite a difficult climate during their studies at Northern Michigan University in the 1940s before pursuing master's degrees at what is now MSU.

While these cases may have been exceptions in terms of their legibility today, attempts to build such connections seemed to become, as in many American cities, easier over time. The late 1950s and then 1960s gave rise to increasing openness within the growing local bar scene, with visible community emerging after Stonewall by the 1970s from all corners of the city — including among the manufacturing workers, many of them queer and lesbian women according to

Retzloff, of its bustling automotive sector.

Even as the queer community blossomed into a newfound sense of visibility, though — with the founding of the Gay Liberation Movement (GLM) on MSU's campus in 1970 and a march on the Capitol in December 1971 — certain divisions remained in the community. With gay men and lesbian women each having long lived not just quietly but in a sense of isolation from one another, the two coalitions didn't always feel a sense of common ground.

With the exception of moments of crisis (such as the AIDS epidemic in the years to come) or political solidarity (as in the march above), gay men and lesbian women often felt driven to find and grow their own separate spaces, with sexism and gendered tensions often creating a kind of wedge. It was within this context, then, that Lansing became not only a space for both queer men and women but an unlikely, enduring hub for lesbians nationally — and a driver for the broader

national community.

A separatist moment

Within a climate rich in tensions between heightened visibility and raised political consciousness, gendered divisions and queer solidarity - and a desire for stability as well as for change, Lansing established its own distinct gay and lesbian spaces. As Retzloff recounts, a gay community center opened its doors in 1972, with a constituency overlapping heavily with the GLM; meanwhile, the Helen Diner Memorial Women's Center opened in East Lansing around the same time before moving to Lansing in 1975 after a dispute with their landlady. One of five lesbian centers nationally by 1978, it's this second space that became a key community fixture not only for locals but for lesbians well beyond Lansing's border.

For Paige Hodder, a lesbian-identifying automotive reporter at Crain's Detroit

Business, this history and practice remains an animating subject — so much so that she made it, along with a second, unaffiliated lesbian center quartered in Ann Arbor, the subject of her undergraduate thesis. While the weekly newsletter published from the Lansing center became one of her research's primary concerns, a second, monthly publication gave Lansing's center its broadest geographical reach.

Hodder describes this second publication, The Lesbian Connection, as a "massive magazine, sort of filled out by contributors across the country. They would collate it all and self-print it, literally in the basement of their community center, and then send it out across the country. By the end of the 1970s, it was probably one of the biggest and most-read national, lesbian-specific

publications."

But despite this reach, the emphasis at the Center itself, suggests Hodder, was less on outward-facing political change than a feminist ethic of care, support and mutuality enacted locally — even as visibility remained a key driver.

"My thesis really focused on 'internal activism,' if that makes sense: how these communities were working to support each other," says Hodder. "They were certainly focused on legislative action and stuff like that... But at the same time, they were focused on helping each other fill in the little things. They would bring in a hairdresser, sometimes, who would volunteer to do more gender neutral or butch haircuts that would have been difficult for women to get elsewhere."

In addition to the Center's publishing work, other activities, Hodder

remembers, included carpools, potlucks, dance parties and coffee houses. The aim, she says, was to "fill the gaps" left by the familial and other supportive networks so many of the women had lost — providing even legal and financial resources in the spaces and moments they were most needed.

One central fixture among Lansing women's spaces was the Michigan Womyn's Music Festival, which ran from 1976-2015 in nearby Hart and was founded by three women. According to Eli Landaverde, the librarian for MSU's LGBTQ+ collection, the festival became a haven for women well outside Lansing, and even Michigan.

"The incentive was to do a kind of Woodstock thing, just for women; that was the background of it. And it really caught on," Landaverde observes. "The festival was not meant to be only for lesbians — that was not the main idea."

A similar separatist ethic seemed to drive the concurrent, continuing success of Goldenrod Music, founded in 1974 by Terry Grant. Like the festival, Goldenrod's mission was informed, according to musicologist Lauron Kehrer, by the lesbian and radical feminist thinker Marilyn Frye, who advocated for the exclusion of men and the problems they brought with them from as many spaces as seemed "feasible" within women's lives.

But the festival became, along with the Lesbian Connection, Goldenrod and the adjacency of the state Capitol, an animating force despite this, drawing women to relocate to Lansing for its sense of community. Lesbians would come, notes Landaverde, from "all over" to attend the Michigan Womyn's Music Festival, often straining to make arrangements and depending on the hospitality and support of like-minded local hosts.

Landaverde says there's a kind of "chicken-and-egg" question regarding the origins of Lansing's sturdy lesbian institutions of the time. With Lansing's status as a capital city, the pull of MSU and a range of lesbian organizations all strengthening the community, it's hard to single one out as an initial driving force or cause.

Lesbians lead the charge

For Cheryl VanDeKerkhove, a lesbian activist and longtime resident who moved up to Lansing after visiting in 1982, the robust sense of community was palpable years after these institutions' foundings outstripping what was available for queer women even in her then home of Metro Detroit.

"This is more than just bars – it's literally a community up here," recalls VanDeKerkhove of her experience of Lansing at the time. "If you were into sports, they had pretty much all the sports. If you were into politics, definitely a lot of political stuff going on. If you were into, you know, sewing, there's a sewing circle... Whatever vou wanted to do with other lesbians, vou had a chance to do it here."

For VanDeKerkhove, community participation eventually evolved into work on the Lesbian Connection newsletter alongside DJing dances and other work at the Center more broadly. The sense, says VanDeKerkhove, was of more robust engagement and mutuality than the hookup mentality and romantic orientation that undergirded so much of queer bar life.

"In the Detroit area, it felt like you could go to a bar, and you could see other lesbians. And they'll charge you five or ten bucks for the privilege to get in — but that was it," she remembers. "Whereas in Lansing, you could go out, meet people — and then you could take that to another level and actually socialize outside of a bar, and do things together that are fun; be there for each other and get involved in actions and do nonprofit work. There were things to do with your time and energy in community, as opposed to going to a bar to drink and find a partner."

While creating distinct spaces did much to promote the flourishing of Lansing's lesbian community, the separatist ethos, even while carving out a space for women. was one whose enactment often failed to make everyone feel welcome. Speaking to these stakes as they stood in the late '70s, Hodder explains that the approach modeled by Marilyn Frye and enacted in so many ways locally encountered opposition both often and early from varying fronts.

"They didn't want just equality; they wanted to center their lives entirely around women - which was entirely disruptive to the gender binary and the family system. At the same time, these groups also faced a lot of criticism from feminists of color, from gender-nonconforming gueer from trans people, because a lot of their ambitions [aims] were primarily championed by the work they did - centered around mostly white, middle-class, lesbian goals and experiences."

Evolving beyond LGB

For Rachel Crandall-Crocker, the cofounder of Transgender Michigan along with her wife Susan Crocker, these concerns persisted in both social and activist spaces over her decades spent in Lansing beginning in 1978. After starting to come out in 1993, she became closely involved with the Lansing Association for Human Rights (LAHR) around 1998, eventually going on to found Transgender Day of Visibility in 2009, an experience informed by the frictions involved in her ongoing experience of activist work.

"Very few people had ever met a transgender person. And there I was at their table all of a sudden - and people were not crazy about it," she recalls, describing participation in Lansing's queer community throughout the 1990s as "an uphill climb."

"I had to do an awful lot of education," Crocker remarks, speaking to her experience on boards for LGBTQ+ organizations. "That's what Transgender Michigan was all about; it was really about education and support."

With time and effort (and no shortage of conflicts), the broader community became more understanding of Crocker's concerns, though an essentialist strain of thought in Lansing's feminist community and history made it harder to roll advocacy efforts into broader queer organizations. The Womyn's Music Festival, for instance, declined to feature transgender-centric panels, and local Pride organizers often didn't see a space for trans people in their work.

"There was a lot of discussion," Crocker recalls. "Why doesn't an LGB organization focus on their rights and come back for us? However, I did not like that idea."

While advocating for that stance, she worked in the meantime to create solidaristic spaces of her own, some

including beginning modestly, gender-nonconformist group that met at El Azteco, an East Lansing Mexican restaurant, and a Transgender Picnic event which followed her through her eventual relocation back to Metro Detroit.

Increasingly, due to these and other persistent efforts. cross-coalitional solidarity became a kind of prevailing model at both a local and a broader level one which VanDeKerkhove, who'd found fulfillment in the more separatist models of queer community mentioned previously, worked to embody in her own activism and ongoing work. By co-founding the Real World Emporium in Lansing's Old Town (both then and now a particularly visible queer neighborhood within Lansing) in 1994, she worked to address longstanding rifts within the local queer community.

She recalls that even in LAHR, an organization founded by two women, none were present in leadership roles by the late 1980s; in terms of racial diversity, too, she remembers only "a little drop of color in there, on occasion," demonstrating an imbalance she sought to amend. "Our intent with the bookstore all along was to make it LGBT, because what we saw with the lesbian bookstores that had come prior is they couldn't sustain themselves. And so we wanted to have something that the community could access — and hopefully that would make a large enough customer base to keep a store like that going in Michigan."

As not just a business but a responsive form of both political and communitarian work, the store - until facing the twin blows of a divorce with her partner and cofounder, along with construction obscuring foot traffic at a key moments for retail in the late 1990s - proved successful, making it a cross-coalitional anchor for the queer community until its closure in 1998. By this time, LAHR and other local institutions increasingly reflected similar, cross-coalitional models.

Modern LGBTQ+ community-building

Today, this cross-coalitional work seems to color local understanding not only of activist work but of the city's geography as a whole.



Benny Vasquez, one of several directors at Lansing Pride and a nearly lifelong area resident, remembered that after a brief move to Houston for work, she felt acutely conscious of her identity — and need for safety — there, in a way she never had at home in Lansing.

"That said more to me about Lansing than it did about Texas because that made it very, very obvious to me how caring Lansing was. And how little I had to worry about," Vasquez said.

"Realistically, I don't think there are queer neighborhoods. I think there are straight neighborhoods. I think there are neighborhoods [where] the rich folk have gathered, and they're all at least presenting as straight," she remarked. "And so those are the anomaly; anywhere else I go, I see Pride flags... It's less about pockets of nonstraight people than pockets of straight people."

One memorable exception to this, at least by the mid-1990s, was an east side neighborhood known as Dyke Heights, a space VanDeKerkhove for years called home, and which, as a home to a dense population of lesbian women, evoked some flavor of the area's longtime separatist models.

"I lived on Holmes Street with Cindy,

my wife at the time. And one morning at 6:00 a.m. we heard a woman screaming outside. So we ran out with a baseball bat, out of our front door, to go see what was going on and tried to help, only to see, probably, a dozen other lesbians from all the different houses on the street, also running out in their bathrobes with their baseball bats to try to find out why there was a woman screaming. It was just us, it was all lesbians, but we ran out to see what we could do to help. And you know, if that's not an example of an experience of community, I don't know what is."

The scream, said VanDeKerkhove, was caused by an aspiring purse thief – and the culprit fled when her posse of defenders made their presence known. Their effort at achieving solidarity had worked. Today, MSU's Gender and Sexuality Center offers tours of the area and other queer local landmarks — though it's less clear if they know or discuss this particular event.

Looking ahead

While the coalitions — and battles — have shifted over time, constant work and a readiness to fight remain the rule in Lansing's queer activism, which stands as a continuing source of life

for the community. Even in the wake of recent gains, complacency seems not to be an option.

"It's not necessarily relief or anything like that," said Vasquez of the atmosphere locally after the ELCRA amendment. "But this place — our corner of the world — feels a little bit safer. Because we know that level of backing is there."

Given queer representation's growth at both local and state levels — with lesbian attorney general Dana Nessel, an openly gay city clerk in Chris Swope and an ally in the governor's mansion — that sense of governmental backing has seemed, with work, to grow. As of this past election, too, much of Lansing can call Emily Dievendorf, who is looking out for the local LGBTQ+ community as a queer, nonbinary person, their new state representative. Dievendorf even has a downtown bookstore of their own.

"It's representation at its basic level, right?" said Vasquez. "With politicians, the fact that they can be where they are and open – and not have to hide or downplay the part that they play in the LGBTQIA community – that means that we don't have to, either."

He Won Lots of Netflix Money. He Used It To Make a Very Queer Movie in Detroit.

Sam Meier on His Shockingly Normal, Accidentally Political Trans Film 'T-Minus'

When filmmaker Sam Meier won a cool 100 grand on the Netflix gameshow "Bullshit" in 2021, it didn't take long for him to choose what he'd do with all that money.

"I decided pretty quickly that if I didn't invest in my art, I wasn't really about that life," says Meier, who uses he/she pronouns. "This was my opportunity to really be able to put some juice behind the short films I'd been making in the Detroit scene for years."

After the show "unceremoniously dropped a hundred thousand dollars in my account — no taxes taken out," Meier says he had to take the day off work. "I had a mental breakdown that day."

After the dust settled and the taxes got paid, Meier took a headfirst dive into a massive project, completing his 12-minute rom-com meets road trip meets harrowing personal drama, "T-Minus." The money gave him access to resources like a Hollywood director, Emily Lerer, who

flew in for the production and oversaw a sprawling shoot that encompassed classic Midwestern scenery and instantly recognizable urban Detroit scenes. Meier had connected with Lerer, whose resume includes directorial positions with HBO, Sony and Warner Bros., on the festival circuit for an earlier film.

As an out lesbian and a woman, Lerer, like the other "T-Minus" production team members, falls outside the typical cisgender, straight, white male demographic that dominates the film industry. "I really wanted to focus on working with people who are traditionally excluded from the industry," Meier explains. "My leadership team was almost entirely queer or of color. And ultimately, it was just good vibes. It was incredible. And that's even though we had the worst production experience."

By the time the filming actually started, Meier says the crew had gone through a series of directors of photography, including one who left on the first day of shooting. L.A. cinematographer Jeffrey Carolan wound up serving in the role after the "T-Minus" team contacted him in a near-panic while he was at Disneyland with his family. "We're basically in tears, on like the third or fourth day of replacing our director of photography. And we're like, 'Jeff, can you please fly out tonight and start shooting tomorrow morning?""

It may have been a messy road to getting Carolan on board with the project, but Meier says Carolan's work on dozens of Hallmark movies would help to inform an ideal tone for the film, which manages to comingle a romantic comedy vibe with a trans-centered storyline focused on a highly controversial topic: abortion.

In the film, lead character Andrew, a trans man, discovers he's pregnant — the result of a Grindr hookup with Meier's Lex, a larger-than-life drag queen who needs a little convincing to accompany Andrew to get an abortion at a Planned Parenthood in Detroit, where there are fewer restrictions than in their home state, Ohio.

The pair take off on a road trip that starts with an awkward vibe, but as the miles tick by along two-lane country lanes and a fun stop at a quirky roadside diner, the awkwardness fades. Lex and Andrew get to know each other, and it's clear a real connection has been made. Soon, they've advanced past one-night hookup status to... something else entirely, though we are still left with open-ended questions by the end of the short.

No doubt the film touches on several hot-button political topics, including the mere existence of the trans community, which has triggered rightwing politicians to the point of absurdity over the past several months. While Meier says he wasn't nervous about how audiences might react to the film, he was curious.

At the Oscar-qualifying Cleveland International Film Festival in March, reactions were mixed. "From laughing to shocked to people who were vocalizing as they processed what they were seeing," he recalls. "You could hear

people thinking aloud and adjusting, and then we had so many people come up to us after screenings and say, like, 'This changed my way of looking at this issue. I've never seen anything like this on camera before.' Really, though, I think no matter how you identify, there's a very human story at the root of this all that anyone can identify with."

Meier says he based the characters on people from his real life and built a story around them. "It's funny how that reality is something so shocking to some people and yet so everyday for queer people," he says.

As a screenwriter, Meier frequently draws from his lived experience, which includes growing up in a religious cult in Wisconsin, a formative set of childhood memories that includes his family surviving a serious bus crash in Bosnia, where the cult had traveled to witness a

vision of the Virgin Mary that locals had reported. The accident left Meier's father partially paralyzed, and while the family left the cult soon after, no longer willing to participate in the "right wing, hyperconservative Christian" nature of the group, the experience left a permanent mark.

Meier often Today. weaves autobiographical elements into stories, partly as catharsis but also because stories about people like him are rare. "I've been rejected a lot through the course of this career, and it's part of the reason why I really started pursuing screenwriting," he explains. "I wanted bigger and better roles than I was being offered. I am a plus-size, flamboyant, queer person. And I see that for a lot of my friends, too - people aren't necessarily thinking of us because they don't come from our communities."



"So I'm less concerned about people's responses to the characters that they see on screen or the people who, I mean, if they don't get it, they don't get it... but on the other side of that, we are emailing festivals in red states to ask if it's even legal for us to attend, so there's that."

So far, Meier says they haven't been warned off from attending or even from attending in drag, but despite lots of apologies from film festival organizers about what's happening in various

state legislatures, he'd like to see more attention on security at events. "You're sorry, but who are your security managers?" he wonders.

Still, he isn't willing to change how he presents on the festival circuit. "My appearance is very loud for film festivals, but also I'm very prepared to dance on every public monument in Tennessee if we get into Nashville, as one example."

When "T-Minus" was in production, it was prior to the flurry of hundreds of anti-trans and anti-LGBTQ+ flooding state houses across the country. "Was I expecting the world to fall apart? Nope. I think one reason Planned Parenthood was so willing to work with me is that I started emailing them before Roe v. Wade was overturned. We had no idea that was going to happen."


Meier said the intent all along was to create a "cute rom-com" with queer characters, which, he says, is a political message in and of itself. In the wake of all the political frenzy, he thinks the film has become more relevant. "And that's unfortunate," he adds.

Looking ahead, Meier hopes to secure funding to expand the short to a fulllength feature shot in Detroit and Ohio. If Hollywood turns him down, he's open to fundraising on his own. "I take a lot of inspiration from ['Insecure' creator] Issa Rae," he says. "She was the one who galvanized me to start producing my own work. She said in an interview that no one in the industry was giving a woman like her the opportunities she was looking for, so she went out and she made them herself."

"I've had producers tell me that I can't make LGBT content if I want to make money, and I kindly say, 'You can go f yourself," Meier adds. "I've been doing it without them, and I will continue to do so without them."

Hollywood funding or not, Meier is not about to stop prioritizing queer inclusion in his productions. He mentions reading about a study regarding why people become famous.

"The only identifying factor for famous artists, in particular, was being friends with other famous artists. Groups of artists rise together, which is part of the reason that community and working with the kind of people I want to work with is so important to me," he says. "I'm really interested in having the community rise together rather than just trying to claw my way to the top."
